



## LOCATION & DIRECTIONS

Namib Desert Edge is located around a two-and-a-half hour to three-hour drive (depending on how often you stop to take photos) south-west and 200 km from Windhoek. Driving West, Solitaire is 50 km away and Sesriem 130 km away from the entrance. **It is accessible in a 4x4 SUV or pick-up, not standard sedan vehicles.** It makes a great first or last night stop-over on your way from and to Windhoek. For a Namibian nature experience to remember, though, plan to stay for more than one night.

### From Windhoek:

Drive 90 km south via the B1 to Rehoboth (tarred/asphalt road).

Continue south of Rehoboth and just out of town, turn right onto the C24 – Klein Aub (gravel road)

After approximately 39 km, turn right onto the D1261 and continue for approximately 33 km until you reach the T-junction with D1265 and continue left on the D1261 to Nauchas turn-off, 22 km.

Turn right at Nauchas, onto the D1275 (Spreetshoogte) and travel 1,9 km km to Mele Farmstall, Farm Alberta. You will be provided with a map/directions of how to reach Namib Desert Edge Self Catering Units.

### Route from Sesriem and Solitaire:

Turn left onto the C19.

Continue to Solitaire.

Turn left onto the C14 and continue until the D1275 turn-off.

Turn right onto the D1275 – Spreetshoogte and Nauchas

Continue up the scenic Spreetshoogte pass. Put your vehicle in 4x4 going up (or down) for better traction. There are picnic spots along the way. Disengage 4x4 at the end of the pass.

Continue on the Farm Alberta and turn left to the Mele Farmstall as above.

### Route from Walvis Bay:

Follow the C14 from Walvisbay and turn left onto the D1275 for Spreetshoogte and Nauchas and continue as above.

**NOTE:** The B-1 is a tarred (asphalt) road, the rest are all gravel roads. With a gradient of 1:1.6 the Spreetshoogte Pass is one of Namibia's steepest mountain passes and can not be driven with trailers, caravans or top heavy vehicles.
